## HALF OF 4,835 DENGUE CASES IN SELANGOR

11 died of dengue from Jan 1 to 20

**A** TOTAL of 4,835 dengue cases have been reported nationwide as of yesterday.

According to the Health Ministry's website iDengue, Selangor was in the top spot with 2,411 cases, based on the statistics by

the National Crisis Preparedness and Response Centre from Dec 31.

This is followed by Johor with 561 cases, Kuala Lumpur with 368, Penang with 345 and Sabah with 341. From Jan 1 to 20, 11 people died of dengue.

Among the hotspots in Selangor were Hulu Langat (Pandan Perdana, Taman Impian Ehsan, Taman Setia Balakong 2, Jalan Penghulu Bandar Mahkota and Kem PGA Batu 7); Klang, (Taman Klang Perdana, Port Klang, Taman Melawati, Bukit Kapar, Pangsapuri Rebana, Persiaran

Hamzah Alang); Petaling (Impian Baiduri flats, Taman Sri Serdang 4, Section U19, Section 24, Section U7, Section U6, Palm Spring Condo); and, Gombak (Bandar Tasik Puteri and Desa 1 Apartments).

In Johor Baru, the hotspots included Taman Pulau Utama; Taman Air Biru; Kampung Pasir Putih and Flat Peringkat 3.

Other hotspots were the PKNS Flat and Desa Setiawira in Kuala Lumpur, Taman Terubong Indah in Penang, and Kampung Baru Pasir Putih and Putera Jaya Telipok in Sabah.
