The third series of the showcase, held in collaboration with the Housing and Local Government Ministry, featured four lectures from 10am to 10pm.

They discussed buyer-related issues.

The Johor leg of the showcase offers more than 3,400 residential units with a gross development value of RM2.2 billion.

It features eight property developers, namely Bukit Pelali Properties Sdn Bhd, Dynasty View Sdn Bhd, GuocoLand (M) Bhd, Johor Land Bhd, the Housing and Local Government Ministry, the National Housing Department, Selangor State De-

velopment Corporation, Seri Alam Properties Sdn Bhd and UDA Land (South) Sdn Bhd.

They are joined by MBSB Bank Bhd, Lionmas Furnishers (M) Sdn Bhd, Oriental Food Industries Sdn Bhd, National Higher Education Fund Corporation and Takaful Ikhlas Bhd.

The first series of MyRumah was held at MyTown in Kuala Lumpur in March with more than 100,000 visitors, before moving to Aeon Mall in Melaka last month.

The next showcase will be in Penang and Shah Alam.
