

## Folk awaiting move to PPR urged to keep belongings safe

REMAINING residents living on Lot 13563 in Jinjang Utara, Kuala Lumpur are worried about the presence of outsiders and drug addicts in their vicinity.

Residents claim to have seen strangers loitering at empty houses vacated by former residents who have moved to the Sri Aman PPR in Jinjang Utara.

"I lost RM5,000 during two break-ins when residents were relocating to the flats.

"This has not happened in the 50 years that I lived here," said Lot 26690 committee chairman Lin Chee Leong, who now resides at the PPR.

Kepong Community Service Centre head Yee Poh Ping advised current residents there not to leave their valuable belongings at home.

"They should always have someone to watch over their houses."

He said residents were worried about their belongings that were still in some of the houses after a fire broke out in the area recently.

He urged residents to move their things out of their former homes as soon as possible.

Besides security, residents also

complained of flash floods during downpours and the pest problem of mosquitoes.

"For now, we just want to make sure the 33 families move into the PPR units as there are 122 units reserved for them," said Yee.

"The developer agreed to pay RM9,000 in compensation and will handle the relocation," he said.

He added that residential and commercial properties would be built in the area, while a mosque was planned for Lot 13563.
