IKATAN EYES SAFETY IN TAHFIZ SCHOO

NGO receives requests to create awareness in tahfiz schools, says chairman

EWLY-FORMED nongovernmental organi-sation Alliance of Safety Community (Ikatan) will add tahfiz schools to its list of entities that will be educated on aspects of safety.

Ikatan chairman Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye said the NGO, which aimed to be a "constructive critic" to the government, had received requests to address safety issues in tahfiz schools.

day.

"Ikatan was established not only to cooperate with the police and the authorities to address crimes through prevention awareness but also to foster a community that cares for each other. other.
